

**YU Campus Climate Survey Report**  
Fall 2023

The Campus Climate Survey is designed by Yeshiva University Campus Climate Survey Committee to ascertain general awareness and knowledge of the University's prevention and response to sexual assault. In Fall 2023, all YU undergraduate, graduate, and professional school students were invited to take the survey. The survey is anonymous and confidential. Of the total of 5,921 YU students, 422 students responded to the survey, resulting in a response rate of 7.1%. Following are the results of the survey.
